	What is a lie ?	A lie is to say something that is not true.
	What is to gain entry or admission ?	To gain entry or admission is to come into the US.
	What is to gain immigration benefits ?	To gain immigration benefits is to get legal residence in the United States.

		Remove (removal): to make someone leave the U.S.
		Exclude (exclusion): not to allow an individual to enter the U.S.
		Deport (deportation): to arrest, then force a person to return to the country they came from, especially because they do not have a legal right to stay.
34	Have you ever been ordered removed, excluded, or deported from the U.S.?	a) Yes. b) No.
	What is ordered ?	Ordered: a judge or Immigration officer makes a legal decision that someone must do something.
35	Have you ever been placed in removal, exclusion, rescission, or deportation proceedings from the U.S.?	a) Yes. b) No.
	What is rescission ?	Rescission (rescind): the government cancels a person's legal status to enter or live in the U.S. after permission had been originally given.
36	Are removal, exclusion, rescission, or deportation proceedings from the U.S. (including administratively closed proceedings) currently pending against you?	a) Yes. b) No.
	What are proceedings ?	Proceedings: a legal case to decide a person's immigration status.
